

ANATOMIC PATHOLOGIST WITH HEMATOPATHOLOGY EXPERTISE

The Department of Laboratory Medicine at Michael Garron Hospital (MGH), Toronto East Health Network is seeking to recruit a full-time anatomic pathologist with subspecialty training in hematopathology to join our laboratory team. The successful candidate will be eligible for a clinical academic appointment at the rank of Lecturer or Assistant Professor in the Department of Laboratory Medicine and Pathobiology at the University of Toronto. Effective start date in May 2026.

The successful candidate will join a collegial team of pathologists and laboratory specialists providing surgical and cytopathology service for a wide range of clinical specialties, hematopathology service (blood smears, bone marrows and lymph nodes), on-call coverage, participation in multidisciplinary tumor board rounds, and supervision of trainees in a community academic hospital setting.

Renumeration for this position will be in accordance with the Uniform Minimum Level of Compensation (UMLC) for Pathologists in Ontario.

Potential candidates must hold an MD degree, should hold or be eligible for certification in Diagnostic and Molecular Pathology (formerly Anatomic Pathology) by the Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Canada, or Anatomical and Clinical Pathology by The American Board of Pathology, and hold or be eligible for licensure with the College of Physicians and Surgeons in Ontario. Hematopathology experience and/or expertise is required; hematopathology fellowship training would be considered an asset. Interest in medical leadership and laboratory management would also be considered advantageous.
