# 's Care Guide for my Ostomy

How I should care for my ostomy	
How to change my ostomy appliance	How to empty my ostomy pouch
<ul><li>Here is how I change my ostomy appliance:</li><li>1. Gather my equipment:</li></ul>	I should empty my pouch when it is ½ or ½ full. I should rinse my pouch at least once a day. Here is how I empty my ostomy pouch:
<ul> <li>Flange (wafer)</li> <li>Protective towel</li> <li>Wet cloths</li> </ul>	1. Sit on the toilet or in a chair beside the toilet.
Plastic bag     Pen/scissors/measuring card	<ol> <li>Put toilet paper in the toilet bowl to prevent splashing.</li> </ol>
Ostomy ring (and Eakin/Adapt/Brava if recommended)	<ol> <li>Remove outlet from hideaway pocket and lift up the Velcro ears and unfold.</li> </ol>
<ol> <li>2. Empty my pouch into the toilet.</li> <li>3. Remove my pouch and flange and put it into the garbage.</li> </ol>	<ol> <li>Bend the small plate at the bottom of the outlet back and attach to the 2 Velcro dots.</li> </ol>
<ol> <li>Tuck a plastic bag into my pants under my stoma.</li> <li>Wine away any stoel/mucus/urine from my stoma with dry.</li> </ol>	<ol> <li>Push thumbs together to open and slide hands down the pouch to push stool out.</li> </ol>
<ul> <li>5. Wipe away any stool/mucus/urine from my stoma with dry Kleenex or toilet paper.</li> <li>6. Weah my stome and the skin around my stome gently.</li> </ul>	6. Rinse the pouch by pouring warm water into the end of the pouch using a cup with a
<ol> <li>Wash my stoma and the skin around my stoma gently with warm water. I should dry my skin well.</li> </ol>	spout or a bottle, shake the pouch gently, and drain. Repeat as needed.
<ul><li>7. Check my stoma and the skin around my stoma:</li><li>My stoma will be swollen and will get smaller in 6-8 weeks.</li></ul>	<ol> <li>Dry the lower end of the pouch (inside and outside) with toilet paper.</li> </ol>
<ul><li>My stoma should be light pink or red.</li><li>My stoma will be moist and will bleed a little when washed.</li></ul>	8. Close the pouch by folding the bottom up 3 times and securing the Velcro tabs on the Velcro pad. Tuck into hideaway pocket.
<ul> <li>The skin around my stoma should look the same as the rest of the skin on my abdomen.</li> </ul>	If I have a urostomy:
<ul> <li>If the skin around my stoma is red, sore, bleeding, or moist, I will need to change my appliance every 1-3 days until it gets better.</li> </ul>	• Rinse my pouch by pouring 1 cup water mixed with 1 cap-full of white vinegar into the top of the pouch. Let drain through the drainage spout.
<ul> <li>If needed, I should shave the hair on my abdomen every week.</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Close the spout and use toilet paper to dry.</li> </ul>
<ol> <li>Measure the size of my stoma using the measuring card. The opening should be 1/8" bigger than my stoma.</li> </ol>	My notes and questions
<ol><li>Trace the pattern on the back of the flange and cut out the shape.</li></ol>	
<ol> <li>Remove the paper backing from the flange. If I've been told by my ostomy nurse, I should put a ring of paste or ostomy ring (Eakin/Adapt/Brava) around the cut out opening and wait for 30-60 seconds.</li> </ol>	
11. Put the flange over my stoma and press down firmly.	
<ol> <li>Attach the pouch and roll and attach the Velcro ears to the Velcro pad. If I use a belt, I should clip my pouch in place.</li> </ol>

## Where I can get financial support

#### Information about the Assistive Devices Program (A.D.P.)

- A.D.P. is a government sponsored program for patients in Ontario who have a permanent (for at least 6 months) colostomy, ileostomy, urostomy, ileal conduit, or continent pouch/reservoir.
- The amount of financial support available may be different for each patient. Most people will get \$975/year (\$1950/year if I have 2 stomas). The amount will be split into 2 payments a year (every 6 months). It will take 6-8 weeks for my application to be processed and for me to get my first payment.
- I can get \$1300/year if I live in a Long Term Care facility or get social assistance from Ontario Works or Ontario Disability Support Program.
- I can buy my supplies from any store in Ontario that sells ostomy products. I should save my receipts for 2 years. I will need to reapply to A.D.P. every 2 years.
